RE-APPLICATION FOR EXAMINATION

I, **Jane Smith Finnegan**, hereby apply to the Virginia Board of Bar Examiners for permission to sit for the **February 2022** Virginia Bar Examination and for a license to practice law in the Commonwealth of Virginia in conformity with the Rules of the Board and the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

YES I am applying as a **Re-Applicant - Option 2A** for the **February 2022** Virginia Bar Exam. I will sit for the Virginia Essay exam only and use my **July 2019** Virginia MBE scaled score of 133 or greater. A passing score for Option 2A is a Combined Weighted Total of 140, derived by combining 60% of the Virginia Essay scaled score and 40% of the previous MBE score I elected to use/transfer.

Ohio	Exam	I submitted a character and fitness application to Ohio in 2014, and later was approved. I was scheduled to sit for the July 2014 exam, but I became ill the weekend before the exam and did not take it. To date, I have not attempted to sit for the exam, so it remains pending.

- YES 6.2 I understand that until I am licensed, admitted and registered as a member of the Virginia State Bar, I have a continuing duty to report immediately any change to my personal, educational or professional status, including anything that would modify any of my responses.
- YES 6.3 I hereby certify that within the four months preceding the upcoming examination, I will study diligently, not less than 90 hours, in preparation therefor.
- 6.4 The filing deadline for the **FEBRUARY EXAMINATION** is on or before **THE PRECEDING 15th OF DECEMBER**; and the filing deadline for the **JULY EXAMINATION** is on or before **THE PRECEDING 10th OF MAY**, and
- YES (A) I understand that if my application is not actually **received** in the Secretary's office by the filing deadline, it may be deemed to be timely filed only if it has been transmitted expense prepaid to the Office of the Secretary of the Board by **Priority, Express, Registered or Certified** mail via the United States Postal Service, or by a third party commercial carrier for **Next-Day Delivery, and the official receipt** therefor issued by the United States Postal Service or by such third party commercial carrier, which shall be exhibited on demand of the Secretary, shows such transmission or mailing to the Secretary's office on or before the prescribed deadline.

- YES 6.5 I acknowledge that I will be allowed to take the Virginia Essay portion of the bar exam on my laptop **ONLY** if I timely and properly register for the Laptop Program. Laptop registration begins the second Wednesday of January for the February exam and the second Wednesday of June for the July exam. The initial registration period extends for 10 days. Late registration, with increased fee, extends until the last day of the month such registration began. If I do not register in the time period allowed, I will be required to handwrite the bar exam.

YES 6.6 I acknowledge that the Board posts the most current pertinent information regarding the upcoming bar exam on its website, and that I should check the website regularly to ensure I have up-to-date and accurate information.
